# PALMS... PAINT... PLANTS!

As part of The Springs "Quarterly Quest residents are asked to focus on specific home maintenance areas. The third quarter focus is the Three P's...Palms...Paint...and Plants.

Palm tree trimming should be done in summer months. The amount of trimming will depend on the species of the palm tree and the amount of fruit or dead fronds on the tree. Palm tree skinning is performed for a variety of reasons such as aesthetics, bug issues, scorpion problems or loose and fallen skin.

Skinning is not necessary for the tree if none of the problems above are noted. Now is the time to plan your house painting project. Many homes throughout the community are faded and need a fresh coat of paint. The association will be identifying these homes in the upcoming weeks.

As you plan for your cooler weather planting residents will hopefully find the revised landscape requirements more helpful. Please refer to the revised Architectural Guidelines, dated 3/1/25.

And remember... if you receive a maintenance letter or violation, please be sure to <u>follow the communication instructions on the letter</u> to confirm the corrective **action you have taken.** The letter will remain open on the account and additional letters may result in fines If we don't hear from you.

# **Maintenance Matters!!**

Our water maintenance company Desert Phins has been busy daily removing debris from all the lakes to help prevent unwanted algae growth. **Residents are reminded to avoid causing landscaping debris to fall into the water systems and are asked to make certain hired landscape crews are aware of the importance of keeping debris out of the lakes and ponds.** The lakes are also being treated with an environmentally friendly product that gives the water a bluish tint. This product is harmless to fish and wildlife but helps decrease the growth of algae by filtering out the bright summer sun. The maintenance committee has also been scheduling service as well as needed repairs to our pump systems that provide the waterfalls and moving streams in the community. The Board of Directors will be considering, in coming Board meetings, a long-range plan for using reserve funds to replace the aging pump systems throughout the community.

Residents may also notice that selected trees in the community have been tagged for trimming during the coming weeks. The tags do not indicate tree removal, only trimming to prevent damage during summer monsoon season. The community common areas are looking great thanks to the efforts of our landscape crew. And finally, the last touches in the remodel of the clubhouse restrooms are completed. The restrooms are now more secure and provide family-friendly changing areas and updated toileting facilities.
